Program Details

Date: June 21-26, 2009

Location: Bryant University, 1150 Douglas Pike, Smithfield, Rhode Island

Participants: This program is open to African American or Black and Latino/a high school juniors from New England, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia, Washington, D.C., and Delaware.

Accommodations: Students spend one week in residence at Bryant University and will have 24-hour supervision and care by Institute staff, which includes trained upper-class student counselors. Overnight accommodations, meals, planned activities, and educational materials are provided.

Criteria for acceptance: College-bound students with a minimum of a 2.7 GPA or the equivalent. Students must have completed Algebra II by the end of their junior year.

Fees: No fees to the students accepted into the program. For students outside of the New England states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island who will be using public ground transportation, costs of tickets (coach class only) may be reimbursed if official receipts are presented.

Eligibility: African American or Black and Latino/a high school juniors are invited to apply.

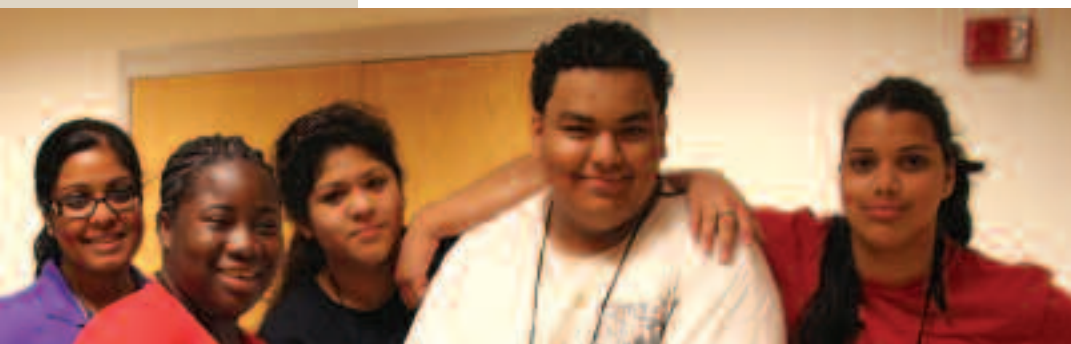
